**Paper Free** - We will soon not be sending letters out on paper. From Monday 24<sup>th</sup> February, all written communication will be sent by e-mail. This is primarily to ensure efficient communication with our families, as well as saving the school expensive copying costs and reducing our environmental impact.

**Road Safety** - On 26<sup>th</sup> February, Dorset Police will come to school to lead sessions for the children across the school related to staying safe around roads.

**Barclays** - We are incredibly thankful to Mrs McCready for organising charitable funding from Barclays in order to develop our school garden. The company have donated hundreds of pounds to allow for the area to be completely redeveloped and fully stocked with plants and tools. On Tuesday 11<sup>th</sup> February, employees will be coming to school to complete the work before it is handed over to the children to enjoy and look after!

**Lockdown procedures** - Please be aware of the following guidance in the highly unlikely event of a full lockdown procedure being instigated at school, in order to ensure the safety and welfare of our pupils:

- Parents / Carers will receive a message stating that the Academy is in a full lockdown situation.
- No one should contact the Academy as all lines are required for maintaining contact with the emergency services.
- No one should come to the Academy as this may place themselves or others in danger and could interfere with emergency provider's access to the site.
- Parents / Carers should wait for the Academy to contact about when it is safe to come and collect their children and where this will be from.
