

Impact of School PE Funding 2021/2022

We used funding during the 2021-2022 academic year to improve the provision of PE and sport in our school. Although Covid-19 had an impact on our ability to implement the planned activities, we have promoted healthy lifestyles in a variety of ways in line with the relevant funding statement for the year.

At Bayside Academy, we have always promoted the importance of sport and physical exercise. We believe that sport enhances the lives of our children by teaching them to be active and healthy and to live a healthy lifestyle. Sport also teaches children morals when following rules and developing sportsmanship. The social aspect of school and learning is also met through sport in team games. Sporting excellence and participation has always been a very strong focus in our school.

We ensured that the school has a variety of equipment to teach a range of skills and sports, both within the curriculum and through extra-curricular organised activities.

Below is a summary of how we have spent the Sport Premium Funds and how the Sports Premium is having an impact on the quality, participation, skill development and enjoyment of PE at Bayside Academy, through the leadership of our Curriculum Enrichment Coordinator and P.E. teaching staff.

£3500 - Sports equipment

£13,500 - Curriculum PE coaching/ Sports provision management / PPG club funding / Staff PE training

£1570 - Swimming Catch-up

£18,570.00 – Total spend

The Sports Premium Funding has allowed us to improve the quality of our taught P.E. education, which has been coordinated by both the school's Curriculum Leader and Curriculum Enrichment Coordinator.

The quality of the P.E. curriculum was supported through continued access to the P.E. Hub planning materials as well as through ongoing staff training. Training activities were undertaken in the following sporting areas:

- Football
- Swimming
- Rugby

We ensured that the school has a variety of equipment to teach a range of skills and sports.

Below are examples of equipment that has been purchased in order to deliver P.E. lessons effectively and for the children to experience new sports:

- Playground equipment
- Athletics equipment

- Tennis equipment
- Swimming equipment
- Sports Day equipment

Additionally, funding was directed for a range of after school activities that promoted healthy lifestyles through being active and exercising.

Impact of Funding:

Within the playtime provision, pupils have been playing small-sided games and learning how to win and lose appropriately. Children have also participated in both competitive and friendly matches with other junior and primary schools in the local area.

Funding was also used to provide Year 3 and 4 pupils with additional swimming intervention in addition to the curriculum offer in order for them to achieve standards in line with national expectations and to swim 25 metres unaided. 76% of pupils in Year 3 and 83% of Year 4 pupils completing swimming lessons met the expectations for swimming from within the National Curriculum. Pupils not achieving expected standards in swimming will engage in catch up sessions during the 2022-2023 academic year.

Bayside Academy is proud to offer our children a wide range of extra-curricular activities which are led by our Curriculum Enrichment Leader. All of our after-school clubs are run free of charge and include not only sports clubs designed to engage children further with team games but also clubs that celebrate the creative arts and those which further promote a love of learning.

During the last academic year, the extra-curricular clubs on offer to all pupils, free of charge, were: Football, Hockey, Basketball, Netball, Ball-skills, Tennis, Table Tennis, Cricket, Athletics, Rounders, Art, Cookery, Programming, Grammar and Colouring Club. These clubs are very popular with our children and during 2021-2022, 80% of our Key Stage 1 children participated in a club and 90% of our Key Stage 2 children participated in a club. This saw a significant increase in participation rates compared to 2020/21. In addition to this, 78% of SEND pupils, 88% PPG pupils, and 85% of pupils assessed as being Young Carers accessed after school club provision this academic year.

In addition, Bayside Academy has maintained links with local community sports including Dorset County Cricket Board, AFC Bournemouth, Premier League Youth Sports Trust, Poole Town FC, Poole Rugby Club, Bikeability and Dorset School Games Initiative. Over the academic year they have either run taster sessions / P.E. lessons, provided information about engagement through leaflets, run an after-school club or accepted children from our school into their external club provision, all of which allowed our children the opportunity to experience and enjoy a wider range of sports. This has inspired pupils through providing the opportunity to succeed and excel in competitive sport and receive professional tuition at a minimal cost.

We are proud of our sporting achievements at Bayside Academy and during 2021-2022 our children participated in the following competitions and events:
