



Impact of School PE Funding 2022/2023

We have used funding during the 2022-2023 academic year to improve the provision of PE and sport in our school. We have promoted healthy lifestyles in a variety of ways in line with the relevant funding statement for the year.

At Bayside Academy, we have always promoted the importance of sport and physical exercise. We believe that sport enhances the lives of our children by teaching them to be active and healthy and to live a healthy lifestyle. Sport also teaches children morals when following rules and developing sportsmanship. The social aspect of school and learning is also met through sport in team games. Sporting excellence and participation has always been a very strong focus in our school.

We ensured that the school has a variety of equipment to teach a range of skills and sports, both within the curriculum and through extra-curricular organised activities.

Below is a summary of how we have spent the Sport Premium Funds and how the Sports Premium is having an impact on the quality, participation, skill development and enjoyment of PE at Bayside Academy, through the leadership of our Curriculum Enrichment Coordinator and P.E. teaching staff.

£3500 - Sports equipment

£13,500 - Curriculum PE coaching / Sports provision management / PPG club funding / Staff PE training £1330 - Swimming Catch-up

£18,330.00 - Total spend

The Sports Premium Funding has allowed us to improve the quality of our taught P.E. education, which has been coordinated by both the school's Curriculum Leader and Curriculum Enrichment Coordinator.

The quality of the P.E. curriculum was supported through continued access to the P.E. Hub planning materials as well as through ongoing staff training. Training activities were undertaken in the following sporting areas:

- Cricket
- Football
- OAA (Outdoor Adventurous Activities)

We ensured that the school has a variety of equipment to teach a range of skills and sports. Below are examples of equipment that has been purchased in order to deliver P.E. lessons effectively and for the children to experience new sports:

- Playground equipment (including resources for team games including hockey, handball and basketball)
- Athletics equipment
- Tennis equipment
- Swimming equipment

• Sports Day specific equipment

Additionally, funding was directed for a range of after school activities that promoted healthy lifestyles through children being active and exercising.

Impact of Funding:

Within playtime provision, pupils have been playing small-sided games and learning how to win and lose appropriately. Children have also participated in both competitive and friendly matches with other junior and primary schools in the local area. For example, two football teams competed locally, with the Upper Key Stage 2 girls' football team reaching the final of a regional competition.

Funding was also used to provide additional swimming intervention for pupils in Key Stage 2 who had not achieved in line with national expectations for swimming and to swim 25 metres unaided. As a result, 72% of pupils in Year 3 met the expectations for swimming from within the National Curriculum with the majority of pupils in Year 4 catching up to this standard through intervention. Catch up will be repeated in the 2023-2024 academic year, with an aim for 100% of pupils meeting the expected standard in Key Stage 2.

Bayside Academy continues to be proud to offer our children a wide range of extra-curricular activities which are led by our Curriculum Enrichment Leader. All of our after-school clubs are run free of charge and include sports clubs that are designed to engage children further with cooperative and competitive games and also clubs that celebrate the creative arts, as well as those which further promote a love of learning.

During the last academic year, the extra-curricular clubs on offer to all pupils, free of charge, included: Football (multiple clubs), Hockey, Basketball, Dance, Cookery, Multi-sports, Roller Skating, Building Club, Computing, Gardening, Ball Skills, Netball, Dodgeball, Animation, Drama and Art Club. 76% of pupils attended clubs, with there being no difference between the percentage of Disadvantaged and Non-Disadvantaged pupils attending. The number of SEND pupils attending clubs dropped by 12% from the previous year to 66%, and this is an area for focus in 2023-2024.

In addition, Bayside Academy has maintained links with local community sports including Dorset County Cricket Board, AFC Bournemouth, Premier League Youth Sports Trust, Poole Town FC, Poole Rugby Club, Bikeability and Dorset School Games Initiative. Over the academic year these organisations have either run taster sessions / P.E. lessons, provided information about engagement through leaflets, run an after-school club or accepted children from our school into their external club provision, all of which allowed our children the opportunity to experience and enjoy a wider range of sports. This has inspired pupils through providing the opportunity to succeed and excel in competitive sport and receive professional tuition at a minimal cost.

We are proud of our sporting achievements at Bayside Academy and during 2022-2023 our children participated in a range of competitions and events organised locally, including:

- Tennis Festival
- Bikeability
- Girls' Football Tournament
- Local Primary School Games
- Inter-academy football
- 'Can Do' football event
- Local Football League
- Primary Leadership Academy
